

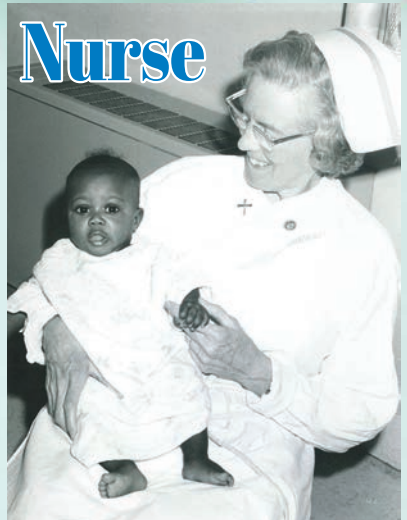

Anita had clear priorities in her life. God and others always came before her own needs. She cared for her own children and provided the best for them regularly. Ana used her gifts of painting and creativity to come up with fund-raising projects for the DHS Mission in Antofagasta dedicated to helping children in vulnerable situations.
