Kathy Reid, DHS ASSOCIATE January 18, 1935 - January 19, 2022

Kathy Reid, a member of the DHS Associates since 2001, was a tried and true Californian. She loved gardening and everything about nature. Her patio and home reflected Mother Nature's best creations.

Kathy attended Notre Dame High School in Los Angeles, CA and went on to receive her college degree from UCLA

in education. She was particularly interested in special education programs and dedicated many years of her professional life to that field. She was passionate about helping everyone learn to the maximum and set a strong example for her fellow educators during her term as director of special education in Merced County Schools.

Reid was a gentle and kind woman who always placed others' needs before her own. She had a profound love for her family, and her granddaughter Kathy writes: "Being her granddaughter was the greatest gift and loving her the greatest honor".

Kathy was introduced to the DHS Associate program and enjoyed every minute of her time with the group. She worked hard at planning and attending meetings even when that meant traveling to the East Coast. She loved company and welcomed all into her home with enthusiasm and warmth, making all feel at home instantly.

When Kathy became ill she moved to Oregon to be be near her family. Unfortunately, Covid struck and Kathy's frail condition did not permit her to ward it off and she went home to the God she had served so faithfully and well throughout the years.

Kathy, all who knew you miss you but know that you remain present to us and to all you served so well. You are at peace as you continue to bring joy and love to us.



Cécile Germaine Cusson, DHS (Cécile de l'Eucharistie)

June 15, 1927 – March 19, 2022

Cécile Germaine Cussson was born in Putnam, CT where she met the Daughters of the Holy Spirit as a young child. She entered the Congregation after high school and made her first profession at the Holy Spirit Provincial House in Putnam in 1947.

Cécile started her career in the classroom in Fitchburg, MA but continued her studies in nursing and received her LPN from Holy Ghost Hospital in Cambridge, MA in October of 1955. She had always dreamed of being a missionary in another country, and realized that dream when she was missioned to Cameroon, Africa that same year. This began a 46 year career as a missionary who dedicated herself primarily to working with and assisting children who suffered from some kind of paralysis that prevented them from walking. Sister spent hours researching her field and working with experts at the local and international levels. She invented devices to help these children ambulate, to "rise from their palets and walk" as Jesus had done. She was respectfully referred to in Cameroon as 'the Mother of the Twisted Limbs'.

Another accomplishment on Cécile's part was the scribing and publication of hymns and prayers in the Mundang dialect, the first attempt to give this language a written form.

Sister Cécile returned to the USA in January of 2001. But, convinced that she was too young to retire, she went to Alabama in May of that same year to volunteer at a medical dispensary and as a private tutor.

In 2016 Cécile officially retired and returned to the Provincial House for her welldeserved R and R. In 2019 she transferred to St. Joseph Living Center in Windham, CT to become a member of that DHS community. It was here that she said her final 'yes' to her Lord and entered life eternal.

Cécile, you were the reflection of God's compassion and healing for so many. Rest in the peace and love of that same God as you continue to intercede for those in the most need.
